Referring to your letter of Sept. 23, in regard to purchase of land for Nancy Martin at Enterprise. I visited this place on the 16th and find conditions there as follows:-

There are now living on this place

Nancy Martin,	age	70

Nancy Martin advises that she has lived on this place for many years, and that George was born there. They have a couple small houses, a small garden and half a dozen fruit trees, and it shows signs of long occupancy. The children, of school age, are attending a nearby district school, and this is one of the reasons they wish to have a permanant home there. They also have a small spring near the house.

George wishes to take an allotment if suitable land can be found and believe he took up this matter with Mr. Terrell who was there in July. I advised him as to the present status of the allotment question, and also that the little place being purchased for his mother would not affect his rights to take an allotment or homestead. Aside from the small place which they have in cultivation, the land is almost valueless, being suitable only for grazing, a brushy and rocky hillside.

On account of the conditions set forth, I would recommend that the 40 acres in question be purchased for Nancy Martin.
